From the Principal...

It was wonderful to see so many parents attending the Meet the Teacher Night on Monday evening. We had around 85% of parents who attended. It is a great opportunity for parents and teachers to begin to form partnerships for the year to best enable their children's progress. Thank you to the teachers who stayed for several hours after school and those who came in on days they don't work as well.

We are excitedly planning for the swimming carnival for Years 3-6 on 27th February and appreciate those parents who have already volunteered some time on the day. Please drop your notes to the office if you can help.

Our staff are always keen to continue their own learning and this week is just an example of how much time our teachers spend on study for improving outcomes for our students. This week Ms Parker, Mrs Steele and Mrs Cooper attended an art course for members of the Peninsula Community of Schools. The focus was looking at how schools can manage the protocols around the use of aboriginal art and intellectual property rights, how this fits with visual arts, the aboriginal perspectives in history and geography and English. Mrs Clements attended The Window of Certainty course for Deputy and Assistant Principals in the Peninsula Community of Schools led by Rob Stones. Later this week Mrs Clements will be presenting a Bite-sized Learning Opportunity in English for students transitioning from stage 3 to Stage 4 high school to staff from Pittwater, Forest and the Beaches Networks. For several afternoons over each term Mrs Walker and Mrs Renwick will be continuing their studies in L3, our literacy program for K-2 students. Other members of the K-2 staff will be beginning the two year program of study in the next few weeks.


